What does a Governor / Trustee do?

Governing boards have three core functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the executive leader to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the performance management of staff
- Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure money is spent well.

Being a school governor or trustee is a challenging, but hugely rewarding role. It will give you the chance to make a real difference to young people, give something back to your local community and use and develop your skills in a board-level environment.

Anyone aged 18 or over can be a governor or trustee and you do not need to be a parent. There is no requirement for you to have an understanding of the education system, just the necessary skills, character and time to contribute.
