



## Sports Premium Outcomes 2019-20

### Evaluation of the objectives:

#### Building Sporting Capacity

- Implementing a new Real PE curriculum. Our new curriculum was introduced in 2018/19 and we will pay our final instalment in 2019/20
- Recruiting an apprentice to support PE activities at lunch and break times at school (Spring-Summer then throughout 2020-21)

Real PE curriculum is running with the much of the staff training having taken place.

Due to COVID any further training that was due to take place from March onwards, and the apprentice initiative will be rolled forward for next year.

#### Competitive Sport:

- Organising, coordinating or entering more sport competitions or tournaments within the school or across the local area, including those run by sporting organisations.
- Partnering with other schools in our MAT to run sport activities and club.
- Training for competitive teams

A MAT leadership post was created with an aim of enabling competitive sport, and diarising events. This started exceptionally well, with football, gymnastics and cross country competitions completed. However, due to COVID shut down and restrictions, no further competitions could happen from March onwards. This objective will be rolled forward for 2020/21.

#### Pupil Engagement in Sport:

- Providing targeted activities or support to involve and encourage the least active children through lunchtime clubs in Spring/Summer.
- Ensuring all disadvantaged pupils attend a club in school if they are not active outside of school
- Adopting an active mile initiative from Sept-Nov and March-July.
- Raising attainment in primary school swimming to meet requirements of the national curriculum before the end of key stage 2. Every child should leave primary school able to swim.

Active mile had taken place, but the majority of the clubs were not able to be actioned due to school shutdown. However, funding will be rolled forward to ensure



a wide variety is on offer 2020/21 and that our pupils are not disadvantaged from the shutdown.

We are not able to provide swimming data due to COVID for the 2019/20 year.

**Curriculum Enrichment:**

- Introducing new sports and physical activities (martial arts and dance) to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities.

Investment was made in materials; however, not all year groups were able to take part in additional curriculum experiences. Funding will roll forward to ensure that no year groups mix out due to COVID.
