



## Sports Funding 2020 - 2021

Sport continued to be a priority, despite the school being closed for much of the academic year. As we were unable to offer our usual range of out of hours sports clubs for much of the year, due to Covid restrictions, we engaged with expert sports coaches to provide an additional range of curriculum sports offer to ensure that our children were still getting a variety of activities, including archery and Tai Chi.

By the end of the academic year, we were able to also offer a limited range of out of school clubs, and we organised individual year group Sports Days so that we were able to have a bubble of parent spectators on site to celebrate their children's sporting strengths.

Our final review of spend is on the following table. We focused our actions this year in ensuring resource was in place to ensure children kept active during the restrictions; enhancing our curriculum offer; and providing training and support to ensure sustainability.
